WorkChoices: Back from the dead

Tony Abbott has said that **WorkChoices** was "dead, buried and cremated".

But in the Australian Financial Review (9/4/13), leaked Coalition policy has revealed a plan to resurrect important elements of WorkChoices.



The AFR reveals that the Coalition policy will:

- Allow individual agreements to run for 4 years.

 Like the 5 year unfair individual contracts under Section 352 of WorkChoices.
- Require workers to individually ask for representation in bargaining.

 Just like the "Bargaining Agents" system under Section 335 of WorkChoices.
- Cut minimum hours of work for young workers.

 Just like the unfair individual contracts that stripped award conditions under Section 354 of WorkChoices.
- Restore unilateral "employer greenfield agreements"
 where employers can dictate the terms of agreements on new projects or business without the agreement of workers or unions. Just like the old Section 330 of WorkChoices.

Opposition spokesman Senator Eric Abetz said there was more to come.

A Coalition source talked about 15 key changes.
