4.0 PROTECTION OF NSW LOCAL GOVERNMENT AWARD RATES OF PAY

Moved: Peter Collins Seconded: Paul Reid

"That the 2010 ASU National Conference endorses the following resolution:

If NSW Local Government is excluded from the modern award system there is a real likelihood that this situation could alter with a change of State and/or Federal Government. The differences in the rates of pay under the Modern local government award 2010 and the NSW Local Government (State) Award are extreme. Where the modern award to be applied in NSW local government take home pay orders along would not be sufficient. Those employees indentified as "red circle" positions (known colloquially in NW Local Government as "present occupants only", or POOs") could well have their rates of pay frozen for years, if not decades.

When and if the red circle/POO does take effect, there would be a significant impact on the living standards of our members.

It's proposed that the ASU conduct a federal lobby for the government to:

"Pass regulations and/or vary the Fair Work Award principles to provide that any employee whose pre-existing state award/NAPSA rate is over and above the equivalent modern award rate will gain access to general award increases under Fair work Award variations."

Employees dependent on federal award rates of pay have already gone for a period of twelve months without access to general wage increases. While the Federal Government and ACTU are supporting a "catch up" increase in this year's Fair Pay Commission order, this absorption issue could well undermine the positive effective of any such order."

Peter Collins, NSW United Services Branch spoke in favour of the motion.

"The National Conference acknowledges the serious impact of family violence on individuals and communities. The overwhelming impact of victims of family violence are women and children and this experience has a devastating affect on their health and welfare, often into the long term. The impact of family violence is also felt in workplaces and in our broader community.

The national conference believes that the ASU can play an important role in eliminating family violence and has a responsibility to work towards this goal. National Conference therefore commits the union to working towards the goal of eliminating family violence by:

- Showing leadership in advocating for industrial and workplace based initiatives aimed at preventing family violence and/or providing support to victims seeking to escape family violence;
- Advocating for the inclusion of clauses in workplace agreements aimed specifically at eliminating family violence and providing support to those in the workplace experiencing family violence;
- Raising awareness of the issue amongst our members, encouraging ASU members to participate in events and activities aimed at eliminating family violence and providing financial and/or other support as appropriate to such events and activities;
- Building partnerships with other organizations in order to achieve these ends. This will include in the first instance becoming a Project Partner in the Domestic Violence Workplace rights and Entitlement Project with the Australian Domestic and Family Violence Clearinghouse (ADFVC) to build the capacity of our union to implement domestic violence workplace provisions."

Superannuation Panel

Chaired by: Greg McLean, Assistant National Secretary

Speakers: Debbie Blakey, HESTA, David Smith, QLD Services Branch, Scott McNamara, NSW US Branch, Tom O'Neill, AustralianSuper, Gayleen Smith, Selectus Salary Packaging

The panel discussed issues surrounding the effects of the Global Financial Crisis on superannuation funds, repercussions of the Government's Cooper Review and the importance of workers' planning for their retirement. The role of unions through bargaining and lobbying to improve superannuation for members was also explored.

Industrial Relations Panel

Chaired by: Keith Harvey, ASU National Industrial Officer

Speakers: Jo Justo, ASU National Office, Vice President Michael Lawler, Fair Work Australia, Dave Perry, QLD Services Branch, Nicky Lindsay, C&SQ C&A Branch.

Vice President Lawler spoke of the importance of an independent judiciary - including in industrial relations - in applying and interpreting the law as determined by Parliament. His Honour reflected on a number of key issues arising from the new Fair Work Act and answered questions from Conference delegates on a range of issues.

Keith Harvey introduced the fundamentals of the new Fair Work system and Jo Justo spoke about bargaining under the new Act and the essential requirements for successful outcomes for members. Dave Perry spoke about bargaining in local government in Queensland - which is now in the State IR system. Nicky Lindsay spoke of a successful bargaining campaign in the Mater Hospital.

Occupational Health & Safety Panel

Speakers: John Nucifora, ASU National Industrial Officer, Russell McGregor, VIC A&S Branch, Graeme Kelly, NSW US Branch, Anna Watson, NSW US Branch, Professor Richard Johnstone, Griffith University, Dr Bob Russell, Griffith University.

The theme of the OH&S panel session was "Don't risk it! Fix it!"

Speakers talked about how unions can be positive about changes to OH&S by:

- understanding national OH&S law harmonisation [Prof Richard Johnstone];
- being familiar with the latest research on call centres [Dr Bob Russell];
- taking control of drug and alcohol testing in local government through the NSW US Branch project [Graeme Kelly and Anna Watson];
- reactivating [re-unionising] health and safety representatives through the VIC A&S Branch project [Russell McGregor]; and
- national co-ordination of traditional state-based approaches to OH&S organising and campaigning.

3.3 ASU AVIATION MEMBERS CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE3.1 AVIATION UNIONS COORDINATION

"That the 2010 ASU National Conference endorses the following resolution:

Item 3.3:

We acknowledge the role of the National Airlines Division Council (NADC) in coordinating the ASU branches and members in airlines. We believe that the airline industry members would benefit from further rank and file structures to ensure that delegates and members have forums to discuss current airline issues and share information so that we can increase industry awareness and achieve better results for all members. Such forum should include the formation of join consultative committee made up of state based ASU airline and aviation members which we request the National office form and coordinate as soon as practicable.

Item 3.1:

That the 2010 ASU National Conference endorses the following resolution:

The Airlines Branch call on the ASU to liaise with both the ACTU and Unions NSW to co-ordinate all unions with coverage in the aviation industry and airport. This would enable our delegates to have a uniform approach to aviation issues."

3.2 BARGAINING IN THE AVIATION INDUSTRY DURING THE GFC

"That the 2010 ASU National Conference endorses the following resolution:

The Airline Branch supports the efforts of our members bargaining with their employers to maintain our hard fought for wages and conditions. We recognize the cyclical nature of the aviation industry but strongly reject attempts by our employers to use the current global economic crisis to justify ongoing attacks on wages and conditions. To this end to support members fighting to maintain the standards in the aviation industry."

8.0 HESTA SUPERANNUATION BOARD

(Referred by National Executive 8 November 2010)

"That the National Executive endorsed the following and resolved to forward it to National Conference for consideration:

This National Conference notes that there are no employee representatives for SACS workers on the HESTA super board and there are two employer representatives. SACS members now make up approximately one quarter of HESTA's membership; it is unacceptable that SACS workers have no representation on their Super Fund.

This Conference demands that the HESTA Board immediately take steps to resolve this issue to ensure proportional representation and directs the National Secretary to report to the next Executive what if any steps have been taken."

7.0 STOP THE NT INTERVENTION – JOBS WITH JUSTICE FOR ABORIGINAL WORKERS

Moved: Katrine Hildyard Seconded: Kate Davis

"That the 2010 ASU National Conference endorses the following resolution:

1. Income Management:

The ASU opposes compulsory Income Management or any Centrelink program which restricts inalienable rights to social security.

Conference notes that \$105 million was allocated in the 2009/10 federal budget to administer programs or compulsory income management in the Northern Territory. The 'Closing the Gap Monitoring Report NT' released in October stated that \$150.3 million of Centrelink income was 'Income Managed' over this period. Conference condemns the excessive waste of this punitive program where resources are badly needed in these communities for employment and social services.

Conference endorses section 27 of ACTU ATSI policy passed at the 2009 Congress which states:

"Congress calls on the government to work with communities to develop voluntary, agreed programs which support communities in all aspects of social life including financial literacy, parenting and caring responsibilities."

The Social Security and Other Legislation Amendment Act 2010, which passed through the Senate in June has allowed for the expansion of compulsory Income Management across the NT and authorizes the future imposition of compulsory Income Management on communities across Australia. Conference notes the opposition to this legislation from a broad cross section of the community, including the Australian Council of Social Services, the ACTU Indigenous Committee and both the Central and Northern land councils. Conference calls for the repeal of this legislation.

2. CDEP and Aboriginal Employment:

Conference notes the enormous damage to Aboriginal communities and employment in the community sector done by the decision to begin closing down Community Development Employment Projects (CDEPs) across Australia.

Conference condemns the 'reformed' CDEP program which are coercing people in remote communities to work for Centrelink entitlements, 50% of which are 'Income Managed' for workers in the Northern Territory.

Conference calls for massive investment in job creation, with proper salary packages in all Aboriginal communities, to replace the jobs lost through cuts to CDEP.

Conference endorses the statement 'Jobs with Justice' published in the Australian newspaper on July 29 2010 and support by the SA, NT, NSW and ACT branches of the ASU (Appendix 1) and commits to a campaign to advance the demands of the statement.

3. NT Intervention:

Conference notes that the United Nations Committee for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination (UNCERD) ruled in august 2010 that Intervention legislation provides clear evidence of "embedded racism" against Aboriginal people in Australia. The UNCERD report also said living conditions had deteriorated for Aboriginal people under the intervention through loss of land, property, employment, legal rights and opportunities for cultural development.

Conference endorses section 18 of ACTU ATSI policy passed at the 2009 Congress which states:

18 Congress rejects that changes and proposed changes to Aboriginal Land Rights Acts, the elimination of permit systems in Aboriginal communities, and the forced acquisition of Aboriginal title to land, have any relationship to genuine measures to protect children. Congress calls on government to cease its policy of making communities trade their land rights for the provision of essential services which are fundamental rights in all other Australian communities.

Conference condemns the suspension of the Racial Discrimination Act (1975) to implement discriminatory intervention measures. Conference also notes submissions made by a broad range of organisations including the Australian Human Rights commission and Amnesty International which outline how amendments to NTER legislation passed in June still deny Aboriginal communities access the full protections of the RDA.

Conference calls for the repeal of all discriminatory NTER legislation. Addressing the acute social crisis faced by Aboriginal communities in the NT will require the ongoing commitment of significant resources to improve community life. Aboriginal people must be empowered to shape the direction of service delivery and economic development in their communities."
