I understand my authorisation remains in force until I revoke it in writing in accordance with the Workplace Relations Act (1996). I have read the information supplied relating to financial obligations of membership and the circumstances and manner in which I may resign my membership. Financial Obligations: Members shall pay subscriptions in accordance with the Rules of the Union. Resignation: 1. A member may resign membership of the Union by written notice delivered or sent to the registered address of the Union. 2. A notice of resignation takes effect: a. where the member ceases to be eligible for membership of the Union: i. on the day on which the notice is received; or ii. on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member; b. whichever is the later; or in any other case: i. at the end of three months or ii. on the day specified in the notice; whichever is the later. 3. Any member resigning shall be liable for the payment of all subscriptions, fines and levies owing to the Union under the Rules at the date of leaving, and such monies may be sued for and recovered in the name of the Union, subject to the Industrial relations Act, 1996 or any Act amending the same. *Please note that the New South Wales Local Government, Clerical, Administrative, Energy, Airlines & Utilities Union trades as the United Services Union.* Note: The United Services Union is bound by the Privacy Act.
