Re: Amendments to Australian Municipal, Administrative, Clerical and Services Union rules

On behalf of the ASU, I submit for certification the attached proposed alterations of Division Two A – Queensland Together Branch rules.

The Queensland Together Branch notified me in writing, in correspondence from the Branch Secretary dated 5 December 2023, that the proposed rule alterations were consented to by over 75% of the Branch Council via a postal ballot and requested the National Executive approve them.

The proposed rule alterations seek to improve the administrative, representational, and democratic processes of the union as follows:

- Modernising and clarifying the intent of a number of Branch rules;
- Branch Conference to determine Sub-Divisions and zones for the Branch amended Branch Rule 20 (b) ii & iii;
- Creation of a full time President option as determined by Branch Conference prior to each election - amended Branch Rule 22;
- Branch Executive, Branch Council and National Conference proposed to be elected by all Branch Conference Delegates – amended Branch Rule 31;
- Enabling Branch policy for Workplace Delegates to be elected by members not appointed by Branch Executive- new Branch Rule 42;
- Removal of Separate Executive and ALP affiliation to be decided on a Division basis by removing current Branch Rules 42 and 50;
- The provision for cross agency delegate structures to be recognised in the rules while also allowing for agency committee or Common Interest Groups to also be created by Conference delegates - new Branch Rule 43;
- Dispute Resolution process proposed Branch Rules to enable the Branch to develop policies relating to disputes between members (new Branch Rule 44) with local delegates (new Branch Rule 45) and with union staff (new Branch Rule 46);
- Clarification of the role of Conference Delegates representing Regional Zones and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander members – amended Branch Rule 47;
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Conference Delegates to determine Branch Policy on any matter specific to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island members – new Branch Rule 48; and
- Inserting transitional provisions ensuring there is no truncation of an existing elected office as a result of the proposed rule alterations – amended Transitional Rule 54.

DECLARATION OF AUTHORISED OFFICER in accordance with Regulation 126 Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009

ALTERATION OF OTHER RULES OF ORGANISATIONS in accordance with section 159 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009)

I, ROBERT POTTER, the National Secretary of the Australian Municipal, Administrative, Clerical and Services Union (ASU) declare:

- 1) I am authorised under the rules of the ASU to give this notice of particulars of alteration to the rules of the ASU and to make this declaration as required by Regulation 126 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009 (Cth).
- 2) The alterations were made in accordance with the ASU Rules and the action taken under the ASU Rules is set out below.
- 3) Rules 8 cb. and j. and 49 a. and b. relevantly provide for rule alterations:

8 - NATIONAL EXECUTIVE

- cb. Each Branch National Executive Representative shall exercise equal proportions of the Branch votes in accordance with the number of National Conferences

 Delegates to which that Branch National Executive Representatives' Branch is entitled in accordance with Rule.
 - j. The National Secretary may, and shall when so requested in writing by National Executive representatives carrying at least one third of the votes of the branches on National Executive, submit a motion or question by letter or telegram or facsimile or electronic mail to each member of the National Executive. Upon a majority vote being received by letter or telegram or facsimile or electronic mail, (with members exercising votes in the manner provided in sub-rule c. hereof) the decision so obtained upon such motion or question shall have the same effect as a decision made by resolution of the National Executive passed at a duly constituted meeting;

Provided that, if within a period of twenty-one days from the dispatch of the letter or telegram or facsimile or electronic mail, the motion has not been determined in accordance with the foregoing provisions the motion shall be determined in accordance with the majority of opinions expressed (with members exercising votes in the manner provided in sub-rule c. hereof) and shall thereupon become a resolution of the National Executive as though it had been passed at a duly constituted meeting if the number of votes cast be not less than half of the eligible votes of the National Executive

49 - RULE ALTERATIONS

a. The Rules may be added to, changed, amended, varied, repealed and/or deleted by a resolution of the National Conference or a resolution of the

- National Executive carried by a majority of votes cast in accordance with Rules 7 and 8 respectively.
- b. Any proposed addition to, change, amendment, variation, repeal and/or deletion of the rules shall be submitted by a Branch Committee of Management or a member of the National Executive to the National Secretary or be proposed by the National Secretary for submission to National Conference or the National Executive in accordance with Rules 7 and 8 respectively, provided that Rules 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 14, 16, 21, 46, 47 and 49 shall not be altered unless seventy percent of the votes entitled to be cast are cast in favour, and provided further a Branch Rule shall not be added to, changed, amended, varied, repealed and/or deleted, without the consent of the Committee of Management of the Branch or the Branch Council of the Branch where the Branch Rules so provide.
- 4) On 5 December 2023 I proposed to the National Executive, as the National Secretary, an addition to, change, amendment, variation, repeal and/or deletion of the rules (**Proposed Rule Alteration**) under sub-rule 49 b..
- 5) The Proposed Rule Alterations were submitted to the National Executive, consistent with the provisions of rule 8 j., by E-mail.
- 6) The materials submitted by email were:
 - a) explanatory correspondence from me in relation to how a vote was to be cast in the ballot (Explanatory Correspondence);
 - b) a preamble to the resolution;
 - c) resolutions 1 and 2; and
 - d) attachment 'A' to resolution 1.
- 7) I annexe as 'RP1' the explanatory correspondence from me in relation to how a vote was to be cast in the ballot.
- 8) I annexe as 'RP2' the preamble to the resolution and resolution 1 and 2.
- 9) I annexe, as 'RP3', attachment 'A' to resolution 1 including the Branch request communication and the proposed alterations to the Branch rules.
- 10) Each member of the National Executive was forwarded, and received, a copy of the materials set out in paragraph 6.
- 11) The ballot opened on 5 December 2023.
- 12) By the 11/12/2023 all members of the National Executive had voted in the Ballot in the manner set out in the Explanatory Correspondence, and I had, as National Secretary, received their ballot by email.
- 13) Rule 8 cb. provides that a Branch National Executive Representative exercises a proportional vote in accordance with the number of National Conferences Delegates to which the Branch of the National Executive Representative is entitled. It is, however, unnecessary for the proportional value of the vote of each member of the National Executive to be calculated as each member of the National Executive voted and the vote was unanimously in favour of the Proposed Rule Alteration.

- 14) On the 11/12/2023, I declared the resolution carried. I annexe as 'RP4' the declaration of the National Executive vote.
- 15) The majority required by rule 49 a., has been met.
- 16) Pursuant to Regulation 126(1)(b) the notice for this rule alteration has been published on the website of the ASU (**Notice**).

Preamble

The Queensland Together Branch Council endorsed the proposed rule alterations via a postal ballot in accordance with Branch Rule 18 – Postal Ballot of Branch Council and Branch Rule 51 – Alteration of Rules.

The proposed rule alterations seek to improve the administrative, representational and democratic processes of the union as follows:

- Clarification of the role of Conference Delegates representing Regional Zones and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander members;
- Workplace Delegates to be elected;
- Workplace Structures to be created and elected;
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Conference Delegates to determine Branch Policy;
- Conference to determine Sub-Divisions and zones for the Branch;
- Role of Divisions in elections;
- Role for Divisions in policy;
- Dispute Resolution process and
- Recognition of a full time President option.

The proposed amendments to the Queensland Together Branch rules are set out in **Attachment 'A'**, which includes the Branch communication to the National Secretary dated 5 December 2023, referring to the Branch Council decision to endorse rule alterations.

The correspondence confirms that over 75% of the Branch Council has consented to the additions, changes, amendments, variations, repeal and/or deletions to the rules of the Branch included in Attachment A and demonstrates consent of the Branch for the purposes of National Rule 49.

Consequently, as National Secretary, I propose to the National Executive the alterations to the National Rules of the ASU which are as per tracked changes in **Attachment 'A'**, together with the other consequential amendments and authorities set out in resolutions 1 and 2.




